# **Methodology**

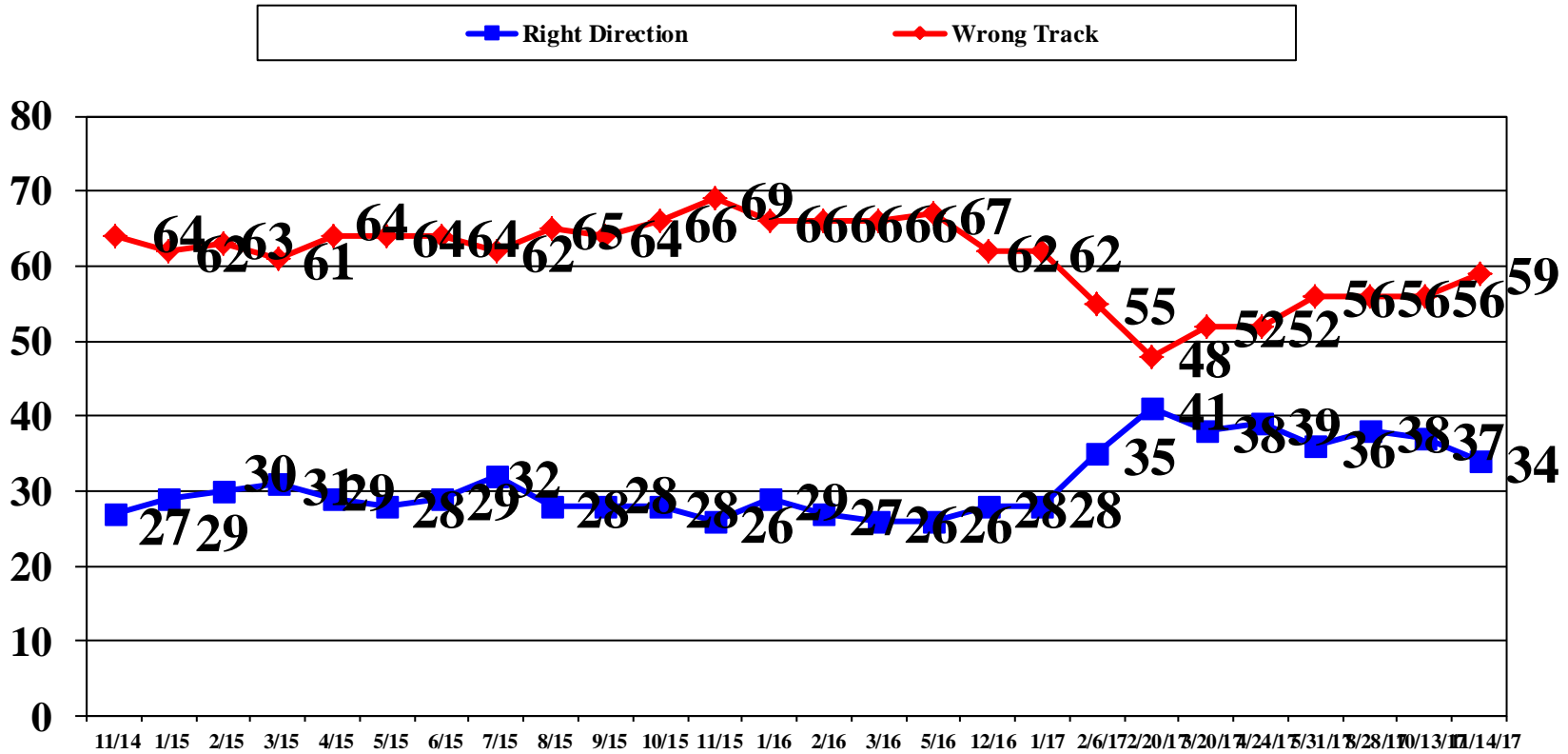
**This survey of 1,000 likely general election voters nationwide was conducted on Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup>, 2017.**

**All interviews were conducted online; survey invitations were distributed randomly within predetermined geographic units. These units were structured to correlate with actual voter turnout in a nationwide general election.**

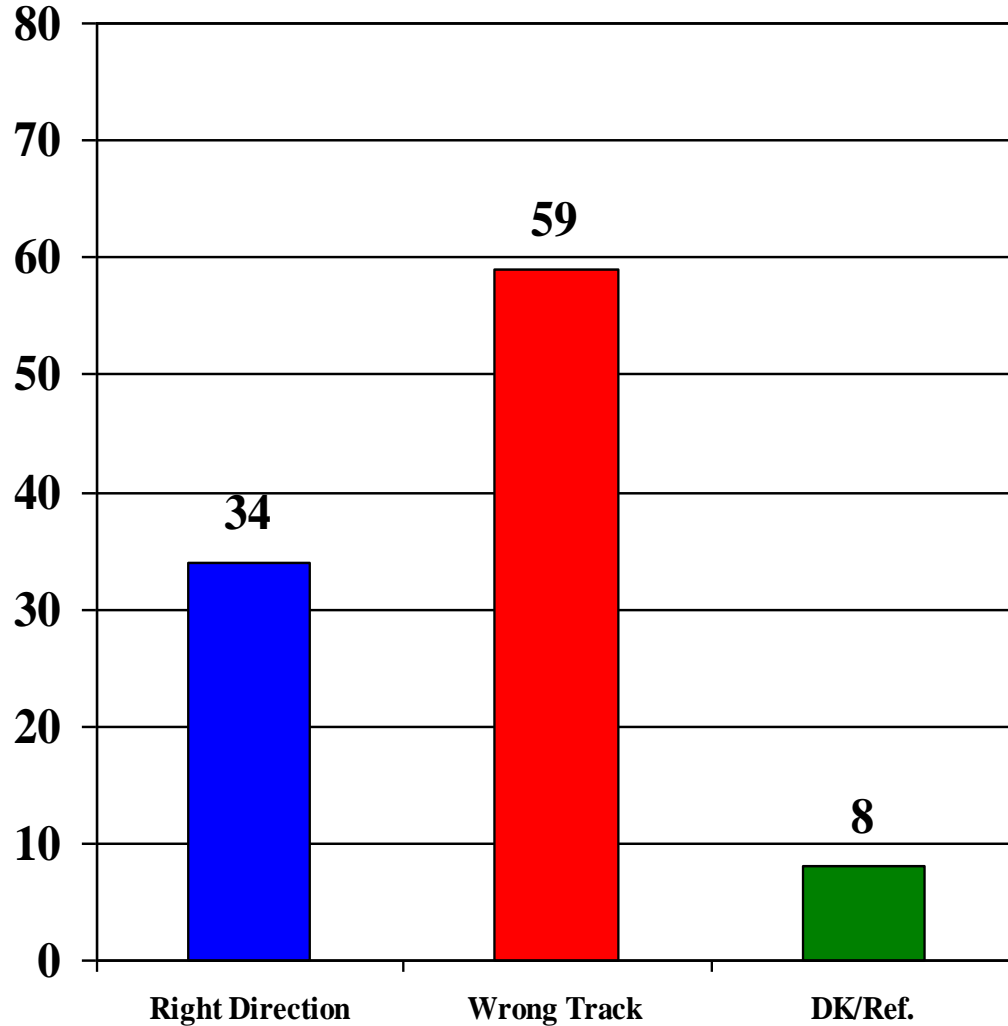
**This poll of 1,000 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 3.1% at a 95% confidence interval. The error margin increases for cross-tabulations.**

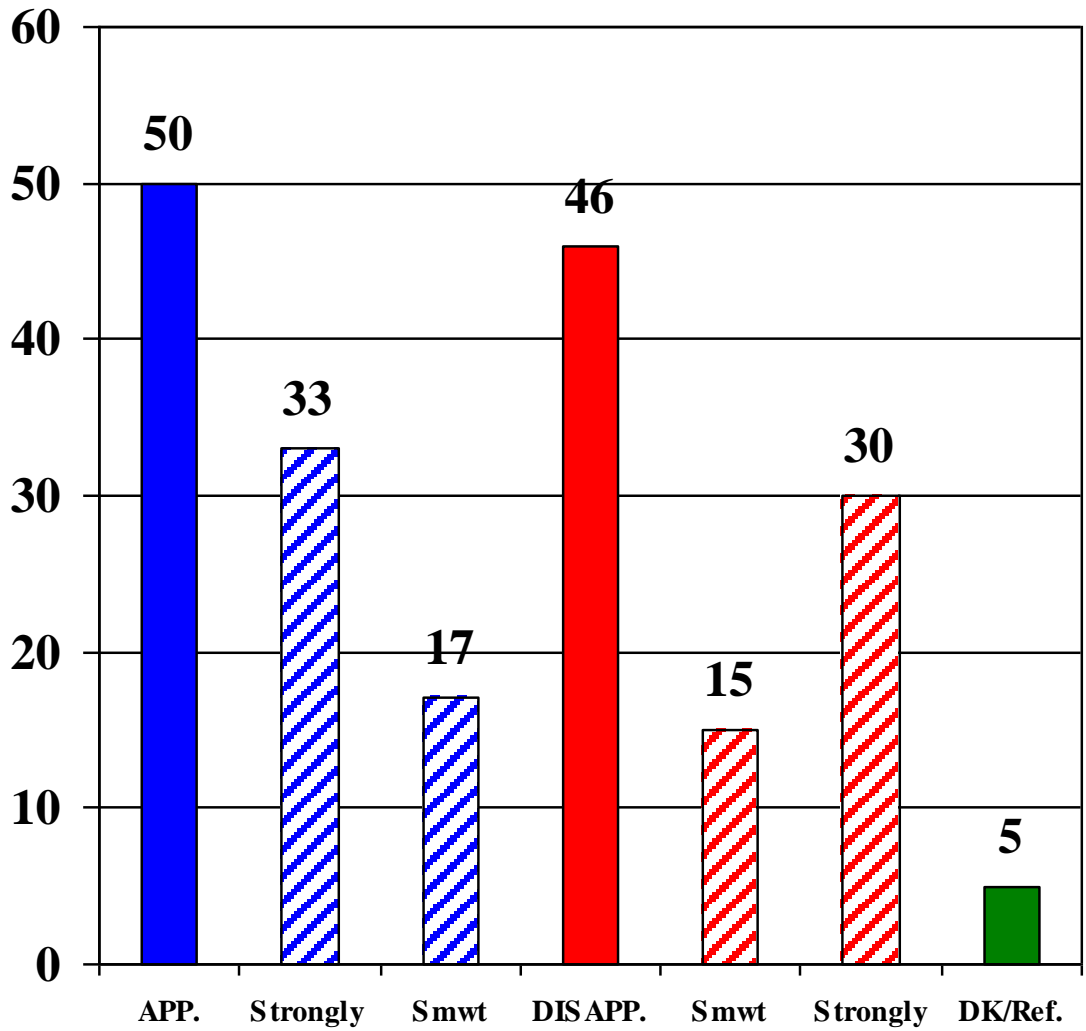
# Do you approve or disapprove of repealing and replacing the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, also known as “ObamaCare?”

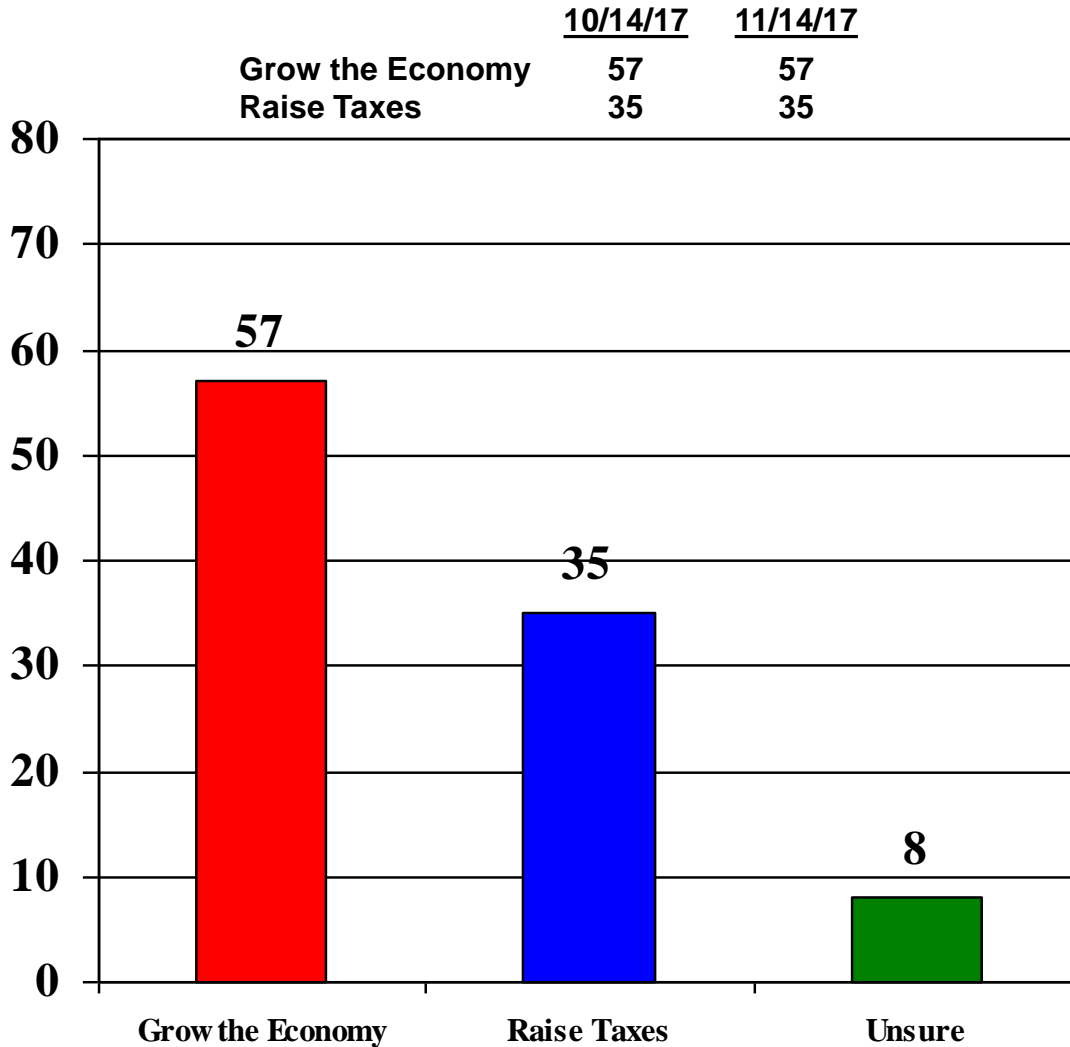
