Would you say you most favor a smaller government with fewer services or a larger government with many services? (Time Series)








Thinking ahead to the 2024 primary election for President, in which party's primary are you more likely to vote? (Independents only, n=280)

Thinking ahead to the 2024 Democratic primary election for President, if that election were held today among the following candidates, for whom would you vote? (Democrats Primary Voters)



Do you want to see Donald Trump run for President again in 2024? (Republican Primary Voters, n=452)



If Donald Trump ran for President again in 2024, would you support or oppose him for the Republican nomination? (Republican Primary Voters, n=452)









If the general election for President were held today, would you be more likely to vote for Donald Trump, the Republican candidate or Joe Biden, the Democratic candidate? (Time Series)


