Thinking ahead to the 2028 Democratic primary election for President, if that election were held today among the following candidates, for whom would you vote? (n=414)



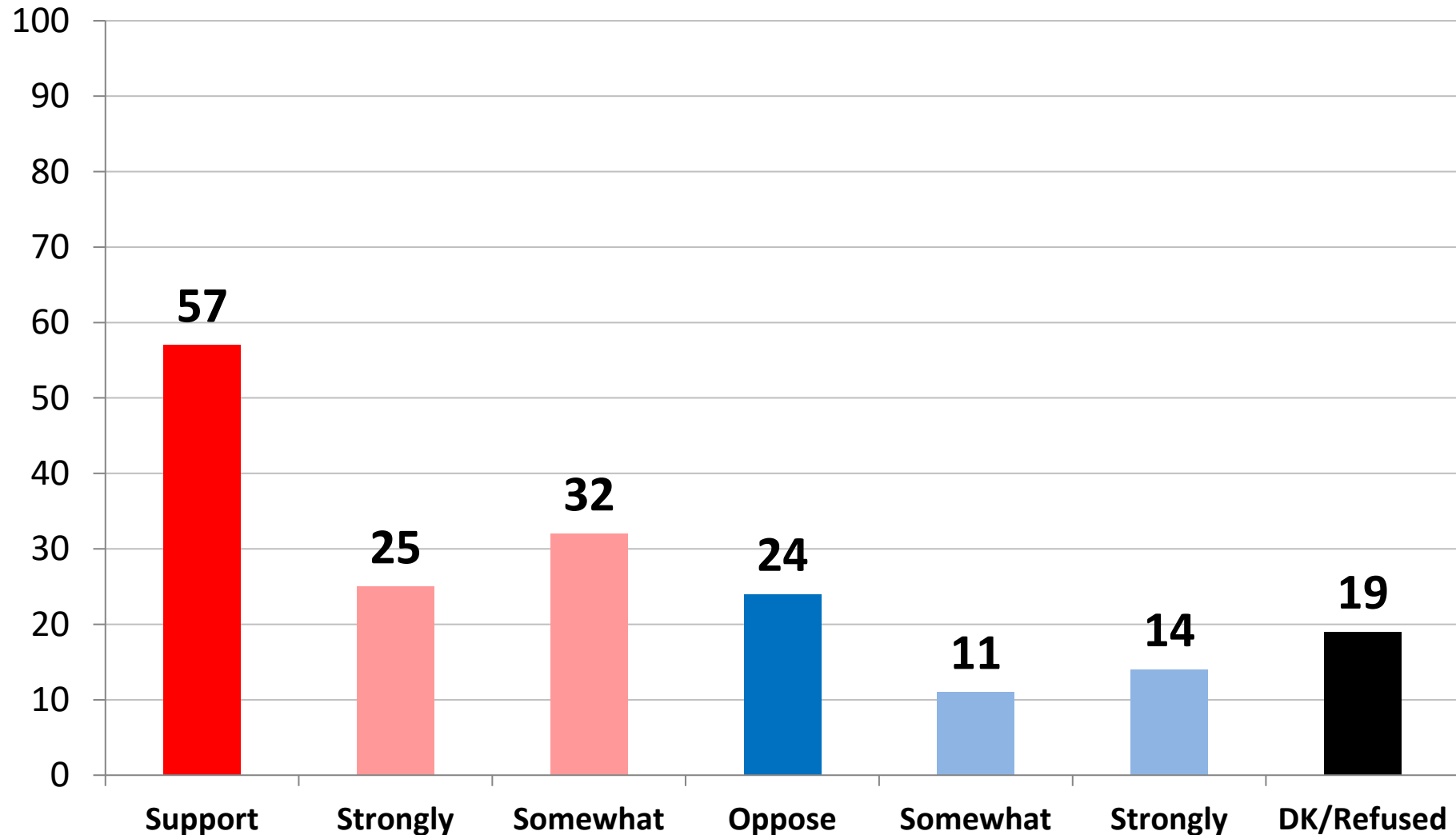

# Thinking ahead to the 2028 Republican primary election for President, if that election were held today among the following candidates, for whom would you vote? (n=453)



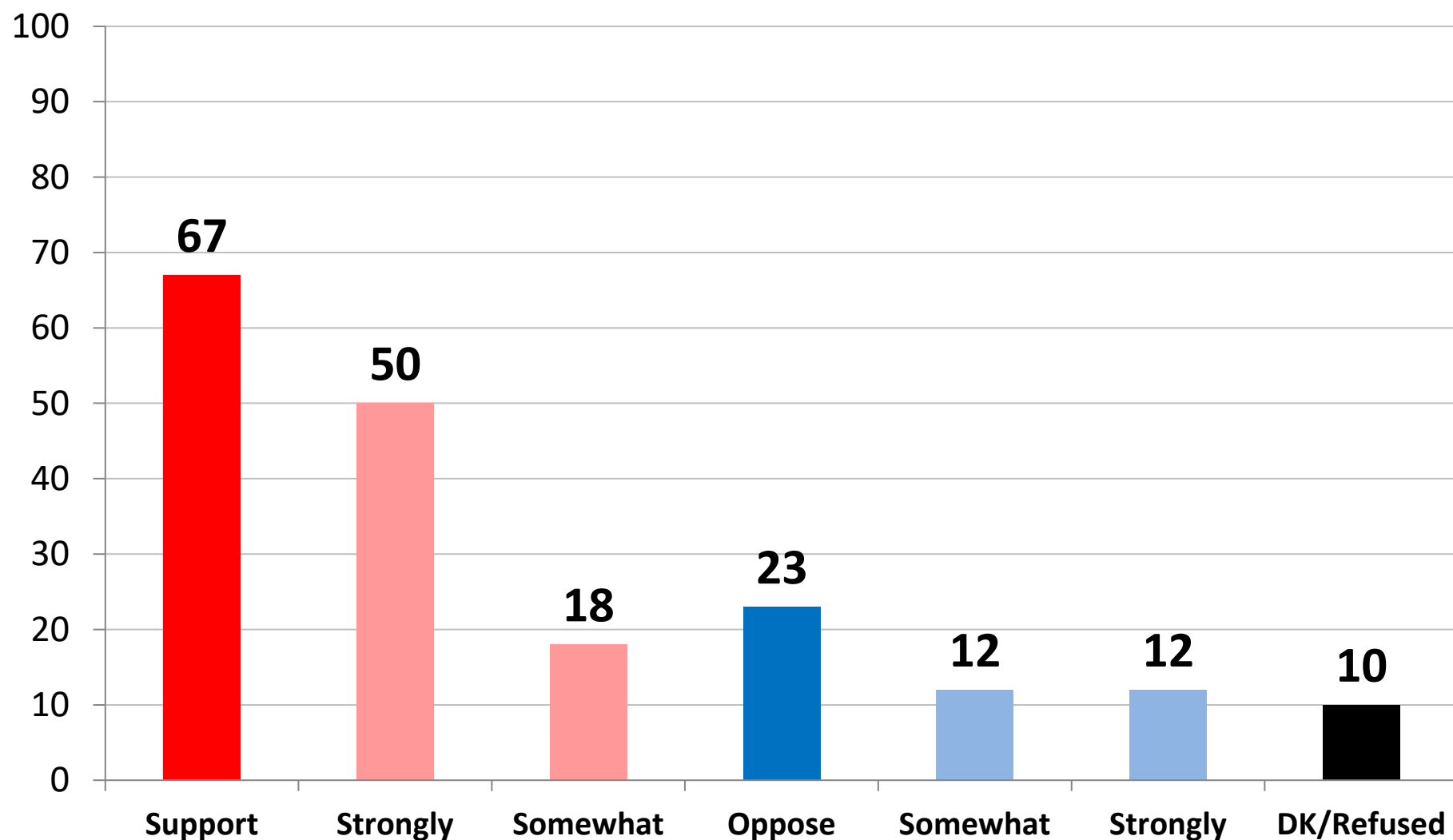

# Do you think the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) should target subsidies to profitable nuclear power companies as a way of cutting government waste?



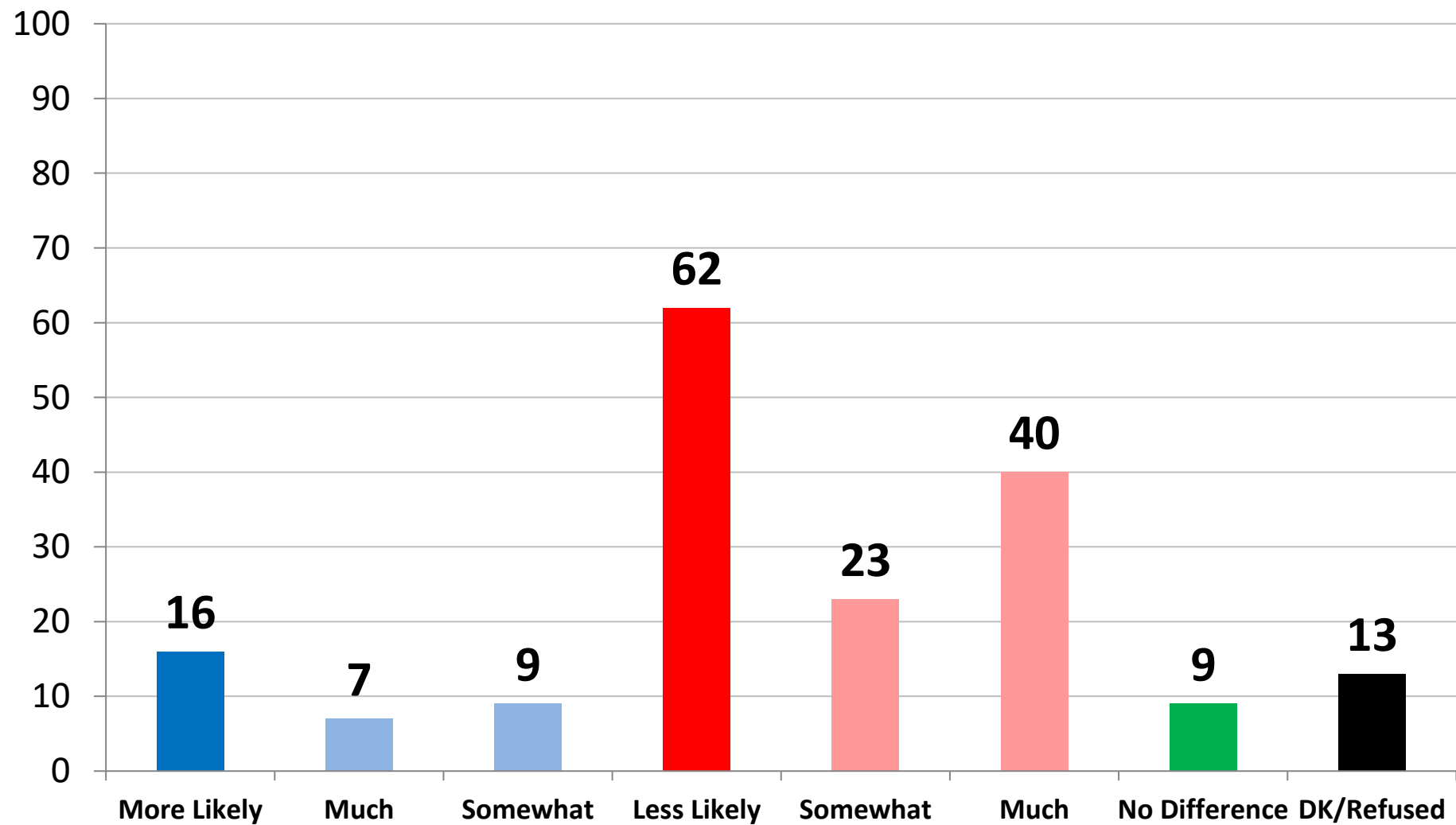

# Are you more likely or less likely to vote for a Member of Congress who votes to give taxpayer funded subsidies to a company with a profit of \$5 billion?

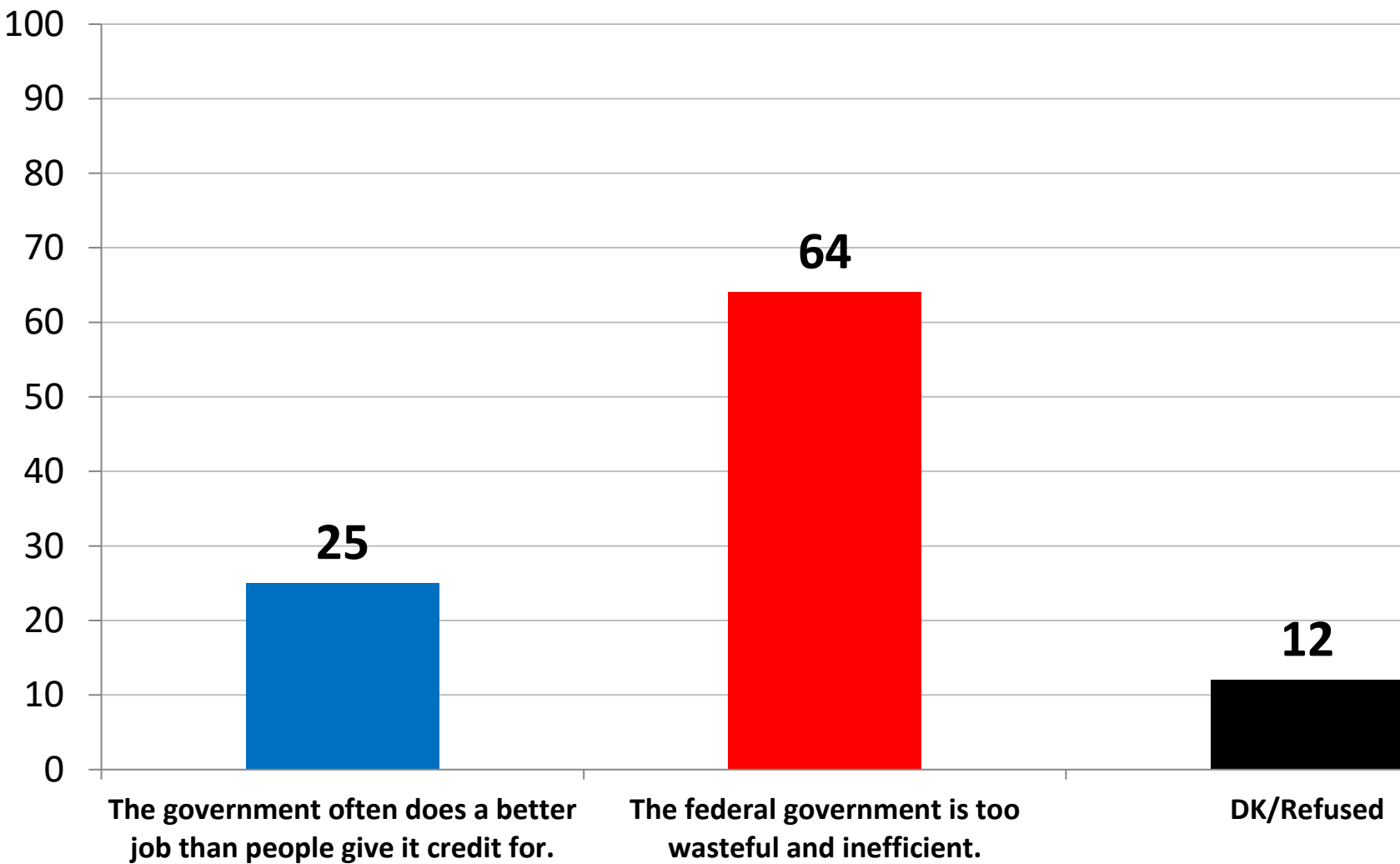

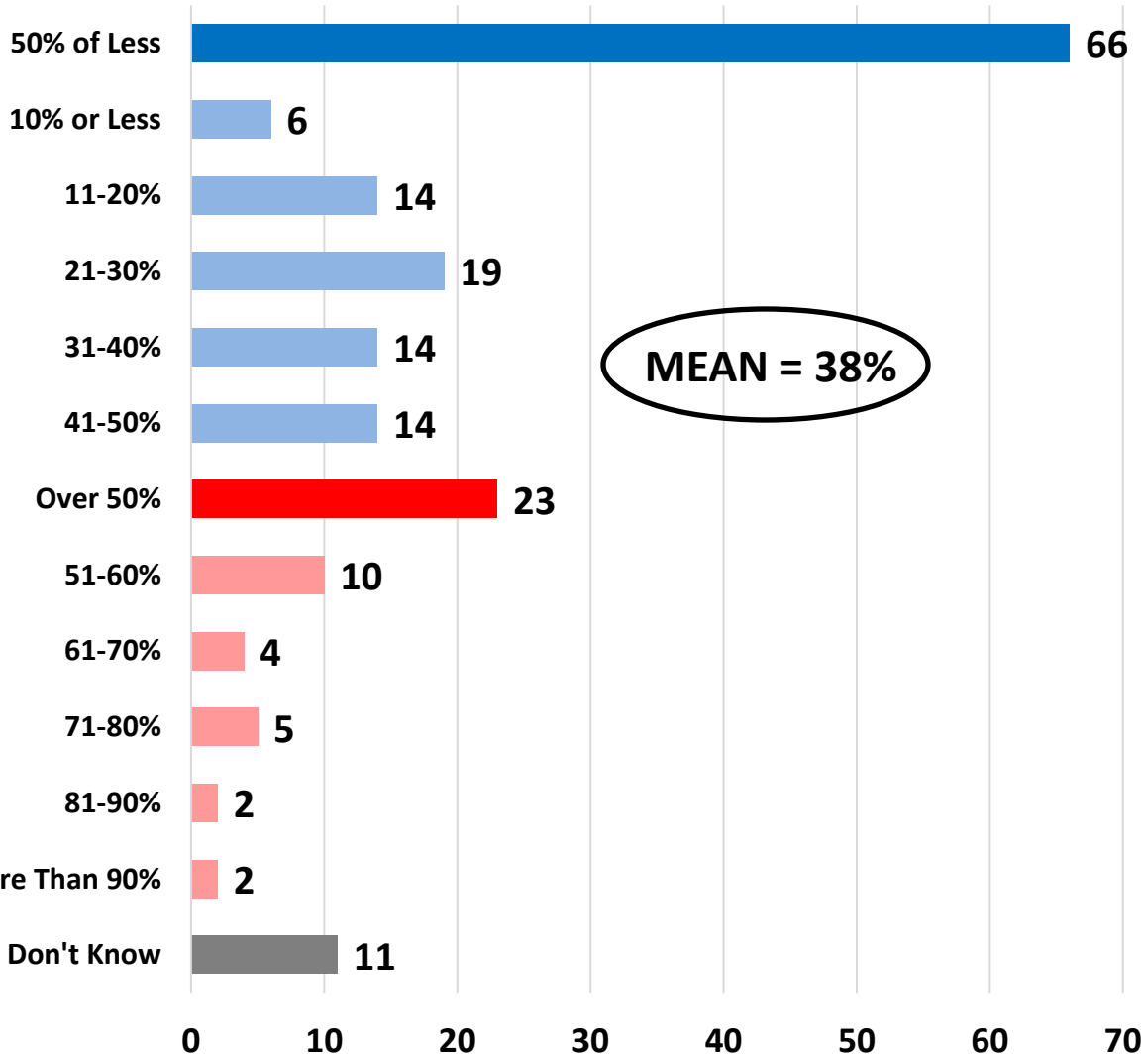
